Your Excellency,

Please accept our greetings from Iran, this time in the middle of an imposed war! A war that is not only a violation of the Article 2 (4) of the United Nations Charter, but the violator has committed such a crime by falsely relying on principles of public international law that even those possessing basic familiarity with the mechanisms of international regulations and relations unequivocally deem unacceptable.

Indeed, this violation is the outcome of a dangerous train of thought that has been developing in the mind of someone for whom the International Criminal Court issued arrest warrants because of crimes against humanity and war crimes (according to the Article 7 and Article 8 of the Rome Statute, November 21, 2024)!

Although the violating enemy began this war under a false pretext, but its main motive was to damage the infrastructures of the Islamic Republic of Iran, commit crimes against civilians, and disrupt people's lives, and as is evident today, apart from the country's military officials and scientists, a great number of the victims are innocent children and women in their homes or urban spaces.

Although, based on the Article 51 of the United Nations Charter, the violating enemy is now receiving a response proportionate to its crimes, but this does not take the responsibility off the shoulders of each one of us.

Thus, I, on behalf of all Isfahan citizens, would like to ask your excellency, as the mayor of the sister city of Isfahan and considering your influence in the field of city diplomacy, to exercise your full authority to condemn this blatant violation and inform your citizens of the infringement of the citizenship rights of Isfahan City's inhabitants.
